

Pennock City Council Meeting
Tuesday, April 3, 2018

Pennock City Council held their regular monthly meeting on Wednesday, April 3, 2018 at 7:30 p.m. at the Pennock Community Center. The following members were present Mayor Kevin Crowley, Council members Jeff Arends, Bruce Bastin and Mackenzie Laughlin. Absent was Dave Miller. Also present were Donovan Peters and Deputy Jared Lange.

Mayor Crowley called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Motion by Council member Bastin to approve the March 6th Council minutes, Council member Arends seconds the motion. The motion passed.

The bills were presented. Motion by Council member Arends to pay all the bills; Council member Laughlin seconds the motion. The motion passed.

Motion by Council member Bastin to accept the Consent Agenda with the additions of junk vehicles, park equipment and computer program; Council member Laughlin seconds the motion. The motion passed.

Deputy Jared Lange presented the sheriff's report. For the month of March there were 77 ¼ hours.

OLD BUSINESS

Mowing bid request packets were reviewed. Bids are to be turned in at the City Office by 12:30 p.m. on Tuesday, May 1st and projects will be awarded at the Council meeting on Wednesday, May 2nd @ 7:00 p.m.

The Pennock City Wide Clean-up Day for City of Pennock residents (residents are those who receive water/sewer utilities from the city) is scheduled for May 19th from 7:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. for *City of Pennock residents*. ***Be prepared to show proof of residency.*** There will be a \$10.00 charge per appliance; \$20.00 charge for TV's for any non-city resident. THERE WILL BE A CHARGE OF \$5.00 PER TIRE. ***NO FLOURESCENT LIGHT BULBS and BATTERIES ACCEPTED.*** "There is to be NO dumping during non-scheduled hours."
