Mayor Crowley called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Motion by Council member Laughlin to accept the Agenda as presented; Council member Arends seconds the motion.

Motion by Council member Arends to approve the Consent Agenda which consisted of the July 2, 2019 Council minutes and to pay all the August bills; Council member Maresch seconds the motion. The motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS

Boulevard Trees – Motion by Council member Bastin to spend a limit of \$2000.00 to purchase trees and then go around and decide where to plant them; Council member Laughlin seconds the motion. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

House in Dirk's Fourth Addition with no foundation – Mayor Crowley mentioned that he had Litchfield Homes inquire about being able to put a modular home in Dirk's Fourth Addition on a cement slab without a foundation. Mayor Crowley would check on what needs to be done to be able to do this.

Garage in Dirk's Fourth Addition – Mayor Crowley mentioned that the garage in Horseshoe Drive is with Anderson Movers of Paynesville. It was at Norway Lake and he needed to remove it from the lot. There was discussion on moving in a double wide trailer to go with the garage. Further discussion and research will need to be done.

Hydrant Markers – Clerk Johnson presented a quote from Core and Main for fiberglass and aluminum markers. Motion by Council member Laughlin to purchase enough aluminum markers for all the hydrants; Council member Maresch seconds the motion. The motion passed.

Lift at the Community Center – Clerk Johnson mentioned that the platform sling arm is bent, and the part is obsolete. Arrow Lift Accessibility is saying that the lift would need to be replaced. Council member Bastin would like to do some investigation to have the parts rebuilt.

Locating Curb Stops - Council gave the go ahead to have Dooley's Petroleum come and move a propane tank to try and locate a curb stop.
